## *Sparkling Wine*

Along with Australia & New Zealand, there are great quality Sparkling wines being produced all around the world, they are often referred to by their local name or region, such as Prosecco, Franciacorta, Trento DOC, and Asti from Italy and Cava from Spain.

The sweetness of sparkling wine can range from very dry brut styles to sweeter doux varieties - French for 'hard' and 'soft', respectively

# Champagne

Champagne is a sparkling wine originating and produced in the Champagne region of France. The grapes Pinot noir, Pinot Meunier & Chardonnay are used to produce almost all Champagne. The wine region is situated in the northeast of France, with the high latitude and annual temperature of 10 °C, the cool temperatures produce high levels of acidity in the resulting grape which is ideal for sparkling wine.

The word Brut is French for “dry” which means that Brut Champagne is a dry, sparkling wine. Blanc de Blancs, in Champagne, means the wine is 100% Chardonnay. Blanc de Blancs typically have more lemon and apple-like fruit flavours. The pink style is made by blending blanc Champagne with a small amount of red Pinot Noir or Pinot Meunier wine, this style ranges in sweetness and dry.

# *Chardonnay*

The Chardonnay grape itself is neutral, with many of the flavours commonly associated with the wine being derived from such influences as terroir and oak. It is vinified in many different styles, from the lean, crisply mineral wines of Chablis, France, to New World wines with oak and tropical fruit flavours.

Food pairing – medium to heavy bodied oaked chardonnay –meaty fish, foie gras, lightly seasoned roast poultry and cheddar cheese. Pair a crisp, light unoaked Chardonnay with grilled or baked fish, delicate & lightly cooked shellfish & mild, buttery or creamy dishes like risotto & pastas.

# *Rose*

Extremely versatile style, A rosé wine will generally be labelled rosé in French and English-speaking countries, rosado in Spanish, or rosato in Italian.

There are three major ways to produce rosé wine: skin contact, saignée, and blending.

Rose has a wide range of sweetness levels from highly dry Provençal rosé to sweet White Zinfandels and blushes. Rosé wines are made from a wide variety of grapes and can be found all around the World.

# *Red Wines By Varietal*

## *Pinot Noir*

Pinot noir is grown around the world, mostly in cooler climates. The name is derived from the French words for pine and black, Pine due to the grape's tendency to produce tightly packed clusters resembling pinecone shaped bunches. Pinot noir produce mostly lightly coloured, light to medium-bodied and low-tannin wines. younger wines made from pinot noir tend to have red fruit aromas of cherries, raspberries, and strawberries. As the wine ages, it is unpredictable, however, pinot noir has the potential to develop more vegetal aromas that can contribute to the complexity of the wine.

# *Shiraz & Syrah*

Shiraz also known as Syrah, is a dark-skinned grape variety grown throughout the world and used primarily to produce red wine. Shiraz historically, the name refers to the wine produced around the city of Shiraz in present-day Iran. Syrah has a long-documented history in the Rhône region of southeastern France, but it was not known if it had originated in that region.

The style and flavour profile of wines made from Shiraz & Syrah are influenced by the climate where the grapes are grown. In moderate climates such as the northern Rhone, they tend to produce medium to full-bodied wines with medium to high levels of tannins and notes of blackberry, mint and black pepper. In hotter climates such as the Barossa Valley and McLaren, Shiraz is more consistently full-bodied with softer tannin, jammier fruit, spice notes of liquorice, anise and earthy leather.

# *Cabernet Sauvignon*

Cabernet Sauvignon is one of the world's most widely recognised red wine grape varieties. It is grown in nearly every major wine producing country. The classic profile of Cabernet Sauvignon tends to be full-bodied wines with high tannins and noticeable acidity that contributes to the wine's aging potential. In cooler climates, Cabernet Sauvignon produces wines with black currant notes with green bell pepper notes, mint and cedar. In more moderate climates, the black currant notes are seen with black cherry and black olive notes. In hot climates, the currant flavours can be towards the over-ripe and "jammy" side. In parts of Australia, particularly the Coonawarra wine region, Cabernet Sauvignon wines can have characteristic eucalyptus or menthol notes.

# *Merlot, Other Varietals &*

## *Red Blends*

Merlot is a dark blue-coloured wine grape variety, that is used as both a blending grape and for varietal wines. While Merlot is made across the globe, there tend to be two main styles -the "International style" favoured by many New World wine regions, including Australia, which tends to emphasize late harvesting to gain physiological ripeness and produce wines full in body with high alcohol and lush, velvety tannins with intense, plum and blackberry fruit.

While this international style is practiced by many Bordeaux wine producers, the traditional "Bordeaux style" of Merlot involves harvesting Merlot earlier. This maintains the acidity and produces more medium-bodied wines with moderate alcohol levels that have fresh, red fruit flavours (raspberries, strawberries)
